WHAT DOES San Juan Mountains Credit Union DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Why?

Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

What?

The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:

- Social Security number and income
- Account balances and transaction history
- Credit History and credit scores

How?

All financial companies need to share **members** personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their **members** personal information; the reasons San Juan Mountains Credit Union chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

What we do

How does **SJMCU** protect my personal information?

To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.

How does **SJMCU** collect my personal information?

We collect your personal information, for example, when you

- open an account or apply for a loan
- apply for an CU service or use your credit or debit card
- make deposits or withdrawals from your accounts

We also collect your personal information from others, including credit bureaus or other companies

Why can't I limit all sharing?

Federal law gives you the right to limit only

- sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes—information about your creditworthiness
- affiliates from using your information to market to you
- sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you

State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.

Definitions

Affiliates

Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- *San Juan Mountains Credit Union does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.*

Nonaffiliates

Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- *San Juan Mountains Credit Union does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.*

Joint marketing

A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.

- *Our joint marketing partners include providers of financial and insurance companies.*
